WHEREAS: The Ponca Tribe of Nebraska is a federally recognized Indian Tribe (P. L. 101-484) whose business affairs are conducted by the Ponca Tribal Council as defined in the Constitution approved July 22, 1994 by the Acting Deputy Commissioner of Indian Affairs; and

WHEREAS: Pursuant to the Constitution of the Ponca Tribe of Nebraska, the Ponca Tribal Council exercises legislative powers to enact and promulgate resolutions and ordinances subject to all express restrictions upon such powers contained in the constitution; and

WHEREAS: The United States Department of the Treasury has promulgated final regulations under the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, as amended (the "Code"), that impose requirements on the Ponca Tribe of Nebraska (the "Tribe"), as Issuer, when it desires to reimburse itself for capital expenditures relating to the capital projects described herein from the proceeds of its tax-exempt or tax-favored debt obligations or other tax-exempt debt obligations issued on its behalf; and

WHEREAS: The Ponca Tribal Council has determined that it is necessary to rehabilitate, improve, equip and furnish a health care facility for the Tribe (collectively, the "Project") and to finance the costs of such Project with the proceeds of tax-exempt or tax-favored debt obligations to be issued by the Tribe or by an entity authorized to issue such obligations; and

WHEREAS: The Ponca Tribal Council anticipates that the Tribe or an affiliate thereof will spend its moneys to pay Project costs (the "Prior Capital Expenditures") prior to the issuance of any tax-exempt or tax-favored debt obligations; and

WHEREAS: The Tribe or such affiliate reasonably expects to be reimbursed for Prior Capital Expenditures with proceeds of tax-exempt or tax-favored debt obligations to be issued by the Tribe or by an entity authorized to issue such obligations (the "Reimbursement Debt") in the maximum principal amount of \$30,000,000 plus such additional principal amount necessary to pay costs of issuance and to fund any reserves; and

WHEREAS: The Ponca Tribal Council expects that the Reimbursement Debt will be incurred and allocated to reimburse the Prior Capital Expenditures no later than 18 months after the later of (a) the date on which it pays the Prior Capital Expenditures, or (b) the date on which the Project is placed in service, but in no event not later than 3 years after the original date of such Prior Capital Expenditures, or (c) such other date that is permitted by law; and

WHEREAS: The Ponca Tribal Council finds it necessary to adopt this Resolution to ensure that its declaration of intent to reimburse the Tribe or any affiliate thereof for such Prior Capital Expenditures satisfies the "Official Intent Requirement" described in Treasury Regulations Section 1.150-2 (the "Regulations").

THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that the Ponca Tribal Council hereby declares the official intent of the Tribe to reimburse itself or any affiliate thereof for the Prior Capital Expenditures relating to the Project out of the proceeds of the Reimbursement Debt to be issued by the Tribe or by an entity authorized to issue such obligations on its behalf and, with such declaration, the Tribe hereby satisfies the "Official Intent Requirement" of the Regulations.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that, other than (a) expenditures to be paid or reimbursed from sources other than the Reimbursement Debt, (b) expenditures constituting "preliminary expenditures" within the meaning of Section 1.150-2(f)(2) of the Regulations, or (c) expenditures in a "de minimus" amount (as defined in Section 1.150-2(f)(1) of the Regulations), no expenditures for the Project have been paid by the Tribe or an affiliate thereof more than 60 days prior to the date of execution and delivery of this Resolution.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that this Resolution does not constitute approval of any kind with respect to the issuance of the Reimbursement Debt or any other tax-exempt or tax-favored debt obligations and does not legally or morally obligate the Tribe or other entity to issue such obligations on its behalf.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that this Resolution shall be operative, effective and valid upon its passage.
