WHEREAS: In Indian Country, an alarming number of Native women experience physical, sexual, and/or emotional abuse as part of a controlling or violent relationship. The consequences of domestic violence poses a threat to the health and well-being of women and men in our communities, and it is essential we come together to break the cycle of violence that burdens too many of our people. This month, we are committed to providing critical support and services for victims of domestic violence and empowering survivors with the tools to cultivate healing; and

WHEREAS: During the month of October, we as a tribal government, programs, and communities, will work to raise awareness about the prevalence of domestic violence in our communities because of the atrocious impact it has on our people's lives; and

WHEREAS: Recent statistics from the Department of Justice indicate four out of five American Indian and Alaska Native women have experienced intimate partner violence during their lifetime—a rate more than twice the national average; and

WHEREAS, survivors of domestic violence have alarmingly high rates of Post-Traumatic Stress disorder, depression, anxiety, suicidal thoughts and attempts, and alcohol and drug use; and

WHEREAS, Ponca Tribe of Nebraska, our programs, staff, and partnering agencies strive to support and empower survivors of domestic violence throughout their healing journey; and

WHEREAS, by providing our communities with education about awareness, programs, and services available to increase awareness to develop healthy relationships and relationship skills and by changing attitudes that support violence, we recognize that domestic violence can be prevented; and

WHEREAS, The Ponca Tribe of Nebraska Domestic Violence Awareness and Prevention Month will focus on youth and adult prevention and awareness, healthy relationships, and bystander empowerment and education; and
