WHEREAS: The Tribe recognizes that funding is necessary for the Nebraska ICWA Coalition to continue and expand the work of reducing disproportionality of Native American youth in foster care; and

WHEREAS: The Tribe supports the formation of the Nebraska ICWA Coalition as a nonprofit entity with a mission to improve compliance with and implementation of the ICWA for all Indian children and families in Nebraska; and

WHEREAS: The Tribe supports the Nebraska ICWA Coalition's application for funding through the Sherwood Foundation to provide general operating support to aid in its formation as a nonprofit entity; and

WHEREAS: The White Coat Allotment trust status was not terminated by Public Law 87-629 passed in 1962 and finalized in 1966, as the ownership was held by Rosebud and Yankton Sioux tribal members. This is the only remaining individually owned trust tract of the original Ponca Tribe of Nebraska reservation giving it historical importance to all Ponca Tribal members; and

WHEREAS: The Ponca Tribe of Nebraska acquired interests in the White Coat Allotment in 2016; and

WHERERAS: The Ponca Tribe of Nebraska desires to consolidate all trust interests in the White Coat Allotment for the Ponca Tribe of Nebraska, through the Land Buy Back Program for Tribal Nations; and

WHEREAS: The Ponca Tribe of Nebraska approves and authorizes the submission of a Cooperative Agreement to the Land Buy Back Program for Tribal Nations that was established by the Secretary of Interior for Tribal Nations on December 17, 2012 to implement the land consolidation program called for by the Settlement Agreement in Cobell v. Salazar, as confirmed by the Claims Resolution Act of 2010 in Public Law 111-291; and

WHEREAS: Pursuant to 25 U.S.C. § 2216 (e), the Ponca Tribe of Nebraska requests a list of names and mailing addresses of the owners and information on the White Coat Allotment that is located within the Service Delivery boundaries set forth in the Ponca Restoration Act in Public Law 101-484, 1990.

THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that the Ponca Tribe of Nebraska approves and authorizes the submission of a Cooperative Agreement to participate in the Land Buy Back Program for Tribal Nations specifically for the White Coat Allotment located in Knox County of Nebraska. The Point of Contact for the Ponca Tribe of Nebraska shall be the Tribal Chairman.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that Larry Wright, Jr., Chairman and Candace Bossard, Secretary of the Ponca Tribe of Nebraska are hereby authorized to execute documents on behalf of the Tribe.
